

EGG DECORATING INSTRUCTIONS

Preparation:

- Use cool hard-boiled eggs.
- Cover work area with newspaper or waxed paper.
- Fill cups or glasses with 1/2 cup warm water.

To Color Eggs:

- Place each tablet into 1/2 cup of warm water and add 3 tablespoons of vinegar. Stir until dissolved. (For pink tablets use water only!)

Helpful Dye Hints:

- Add 1 tbsp. of water to container. Drop tablet in water for color confirmation.
- Add vinegar (tablet will dissolve quicker).
- Add remaining water to container.
- Place egg in container until desired shade is obtained. For brighter color, leave egg in container longer. Use egg dipper to remove colored egg. Drain well and set aside to dry. Allow egg to completely dry before decorating.

Magic Crayon:

- Before coloring eggs, take a cool hard-boiled egg and write or draw on the egg using the Magic Crayon.
- When finished place the egg into any egg color. (After following egg decorating instructions.)
- When you remove the egg the design will show through!

Egg Wrappits™: (ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED!) For best results use hot water and large eggs.

- Slip the Egg Wrappits™ around a large hard-boiled egg that has had time to cool.
- Submerge the egg into the hot water using the wire egg dipper, metal tongs, or spoon. Allow the wrapped egg to cool before handling.

Eggchievement Awards:

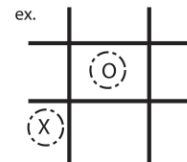
- Cut awards from side of box and tape ends together like eggstands to use in your very own egg coloring contest.

Tic-Tac-Toe Game:

- Cut green egg pattern strips from side of box to create your own tic-tac-toe board
- Use fun tops on back of box for X & O chips. (turn over and put X & O on back of chip.)

Fun Tops:

- Use a toothpick in middle of circle and spin like a top!
